Reading Activity Choices

Two at least, Three would be better, Four would be great!

<p><u>Have someone time you</u> to help increase your reading fluency or how fast you read. Time/track yourself for 1 minute each night to see growth.</p>	<p>Write down questions about the story. Remember, questions can start with <u>who, what, when, where and why</u>. Also put answers with those questions. If you read the book to someone, ask them the questions after reading.</p>	<p>List the <u>characters or facts</u> from the stories you read. <u>Make a list of character traits</u> from fiction stories or facts from non-fiction stories. Make character puppets or a poster of the characters.</p>
<p><u>Compare two books that you read this week</u>. Make a list of how they books were the same and how they were different.</p>	<p><u>Make a list/word cards</u> for words that were hard to read in the story. Practice the words in isolation to learn them.</p>	<p><u>Make a list of things that show evidence of where the story took place or the setting</u>. Were there any elements of time or clues-time of day-night, morning, evening Elements that describe the setting.</p>
<p>Read the book out loud and record yourself on a tape recorder.</p>	<p>Check out books you can practice from school and public library. Read both fiction/non-fiction books.</p>	<p>Write down actions that happened in the beginning, middle and end of the fictional (not real) stories.</p>

<p>Find synonyms (words that mean the same thing) for your words.</p>	<p>Practice the words out loud with an adult.</p>	<p>Write a sentence for each of ten of the words.</p>
